I am writing to you on behalf of the Canadian Intellectual Property Council (CIPC) to congratulate you on your appointment as Minister of Canadian Heritage and Official Languages.

The Canadian Intellectual Property Council is a Canadian business coalition - supported by the Canadian Chamber of Commerce - designed to provide a central voice to press for stronger intellectual property protection both in Canada and worldwide. Launched on May 26th, 2008, the CIPC's primary objective is to ensure that the Canadian government provides the necessary legislative framework and sufficient resources to combat the rampant counterfeiting and piracy of intellectual property. Our members represent a broad range of industries including pharmaceuticals, software, entertainment and consumer goods, all of which rely on intellectual property rights for their success.

The CIPC was pleased to see in your party's election platform that the government is committed to re-introducing copyright legislation, to introduce tougher new laws on counterfeiting and piracy, and to give customs and law enforcement services the necessary resources to fight these crimes.
